PRESENTATION OF THE "OUTSTANDING EMPLOYEE TEAM OF THE QUARTER" AWARD.

Supervisor Brown announced that the Health and Human Services Department Payroll/Personnel Unit was the recipient of the "Outstanding Employee Team of the Quarter" award and identified the members of the team as follows: Sandy Cheang, Adora Gutierrez, Mariko Kawamura, Denise Martinez, and Pat Thompson. Each member of the Team received a cash award, an engraved plaque, and a gift commemorating the occasion.

Health and Human Services Director Dr. Larry Meredith acknowledged the commitment of the Team and presented the members with the Department's Shining Star award.

Ms. Patri gave a visual presentation illustrating the Binford Road LLC Storage Facility proposal which requires a Countywide Plan Amendment and Rezoning to develop the western 29 acres (16.25 acres of dryland) of the 47.3-acre project site as a multi-purpose self-storage facility. The project includes maintaining 4.1 acres of wetlands restored as part of the 2000-2001 site clean-up and restoring an additional 2.5 acres as tidal wetlands. Ms. Patri stated that the project was proposed to be developed in three phases. Ms. Patri gave a brief overview of the background of the project site and the 1996 Stipulated Judgment ordering cleanup of the site.

Ms. Patri reported that the Planning Commission's recommended action to deny the proposed project was based on inconsistencies between the project and current Countywide Plan ("CWP") Environmental policies relating to the Bayfront Conservation Zone as well as the finding that it would be premature to consider amending the CWP land use designation and zoning changes for the project site in advance of completion of the current CWP update.

Attorney Neil Sorensen representing the applicant, Binford Road LLC, addressed the Board and gave a brief history of the property noting that a canal through the center of the site has existed since the early 1920's. Mr. Sorensen reported on several issues including conditions of a 1977 Stipulated Judgment and a 1996 Stipulated Judgment, results of the 2000 Environmental Assessment adopted by the Planning Commission, and the restoration of wetlands as part of the 2000-2001 site clean-up. Mr. Sorenson presented a modified plan that would reduce development to the western 19.34 acres (9.54 acres of dryland) of the 47.3-acre site and increase wetlands restoration to 8.25 acres. All acreage (27.96 acres) east of the development would be dedicated to open space.

Mr. Sorensen concluded his report and advised that the modified project proposes reasonable development of the site, while respecting the environmental constraints of the area.

In response to a question from Supervisor Murray regarding the modified conceptual site plan, Ms. Patri briefly commented on the modified plan and advised that more time was needed to review the abstract plan. Ms. Patri reported that during the original review of the proposed project by staff, build-out of Phase I appeared to be acceptable.

Mr. Sorensen responded to several questions from the Board regarding drainage, size of buildings, turnaround for emergency vehicles, and excavation and fill work.

Board members and staff discussed several issues around the modified plan, including hydrology calculations and holding ponds, a restoration plan for the additional acreage proposed to be restored, and distance of the modified development from the wetlands.

The hearing was declared open for public comment.

Representatives of the Marin Conservation League, the Sierra Club Marin Group, the Marin Audubon Society, and a member of the public expressed concerns regarding preservation of environmental resources and urged the Board to deny the Binford Road LLC Storage Facility applications as recommended by the Planning Commission.

Seeing no one else present to speak, the hearing was closed.

Board members and staff continued to discuss several concerns including potential consistencies with the 2000 Environmental Assessment, the need for the preparation of an Environment Impact Report ("EIR"), green building practices, and potential inconsistencies with CWP plan policies of the Bay Front Conservation Zone.

Supervisors Murray and Kinsey urged Board members to come to a decision today and briefly commented on several public benefits of this project including open space protection and an increase in wetlands.

Supervisors McGlashan and Adams briefly commented on the negative declaration proposal, toxic elements of the project site, and considered a review of the applicant's modified proposal by the Planning Commission.

Planning Commissioners Don Dickenson and Randy Greenberg addressed the Board and advised that the Commission had decided unanimously that given the location and setting of the project site and the Binford Road LLC Storage Facility proposal, a negative declaration was not appropriate; an EIR should be required for the proposed project; and as proposed, Phase I did not address the concerns of the Planning Commission.

Supervisor Brown suggested staff review the modified project and bring the project back to the Board at a future date.

M/s Supervisor Kinsey - Supervisor Murray to continue the Binford Road LLC Storage Facility Countywide Plan Amendment, Rezoning, Master Plan, Land Division, and Tidelands Permit hearing within eight weeks in order to provide staff time to review the modified proposal from the applicant and to provide a staff response to that proposal.

Supervisor Murray requested that the hearing be continued to December 19, 2006.

Thereafter, the maker of the motion agreed to amend the motion to continue the hearing to December 19, 2006. The seconder of the motion accepted the amendment to the motion.

M/s Supervisor Kinsey - Supervisor Murray to amend the motion to continue the Binford Road LLC Storage Facility Countywide Plan Amendment, Rezoning, Master Plan, Land Division, and Tidelands Permit hearing to December 19, 2006.
