RESOLUTION OF THE MARIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN THE MATTER OF A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION (FDA) BANNING MENTHOL IN CIGARETTES AND FLAVORING IN OTHER TOBACCO PRODUCTS

- **WHEREAS**, mentholated and flavored tobacco products are shown to be "starter" products for youth who begin using tobacco; ^{i,ii,iii}
- **WHEREAS**, youth who experiment with menthol cigarettes are at far greater risk of becoming regular smokers than those who experiment with non-menthol cigarettes.^{iv}
- **WHEREAS**, the Tobacco Industry has been manipulating the dose of menthol in cigarettes to ensure the uptake and continued use, especially by young people and other vulnerable populations for many years; ^v
- **WHEREAS**, the tobacco industry has a well-documented history of developing and marketing mentholated brands to racial and ethnic minorities and youth; vi,vii
- **WHEREAS**, in cigarettes, menthol is the only additive that is actively marketed to consumers and virtually all cigarettes contain menthol to make cigarettes more palatable; viii
- **WHEREAS**, the Tobacco Industry has targeted African Americans with mentholated products and as a result nearly 83% of African American smokers smoke menthol cigarettes, compared with 24% of White smokers; ix,x,xi
- **WHEREAS**, 71% of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and Questioning (LGBTQ) smokers, particularly youth, smoke menthol cigarettes; ^{xii}
- **WHEREAS**, the availability of menthol cigarettes reduces cessation success, particularly among African Americans. XiIII
- **WHEREAS**, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has the authority to issue product standards to promote public health, which can include eliminating or reducing certain ingredients;
- **WHEREAS**, the FDA prohibits cigarettes from having candy, fruit and spice as their characterizing flavors because these flavors make tobacco products especially appealing to youth, and can lead to a lifetime of tobacco addiction; xiv
- **WHEREAS**, menthol was exempted from this ban on candy, fruit and spice as characterizing flavors in cigarettes;
- **WHEREAS**, other tobacco products (smokeless, little cigars, hookah tobacco, dissolvable tobacco products) are exempted from this ban on candy, fruit and spice as characterizing flavors;
- **WHEREAS**, the Tobacco Products Scientific Advisory Committee (TPSAC) recommendations to the FDA state that, "Removal of menthol cigarettes from the marketplace would benefit public health in the United States"; ^{xv}

WHEREAS, the Marin County Board of Supervisors is committed to the health and wellbeing of it's residents and is particularly concerned about preventing tobacco use among youth;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Marin County Board of Supervisors hereby supports the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's exercise of its authority to ban the use of menthol in cigarettes and flavorings in other tobacco products in the United States.
